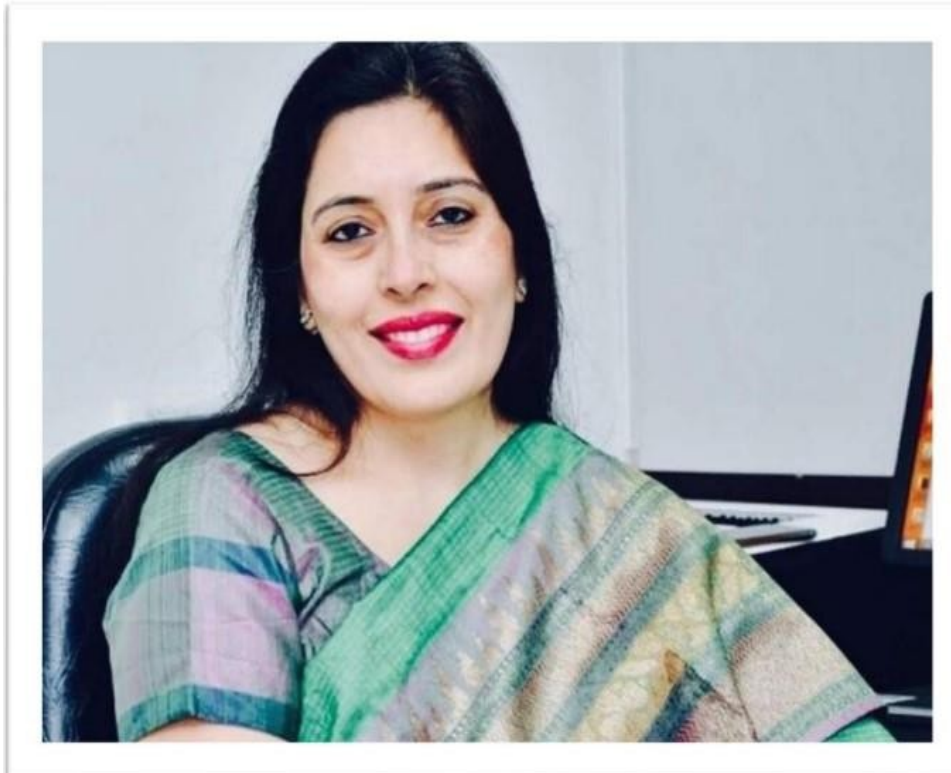


## PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

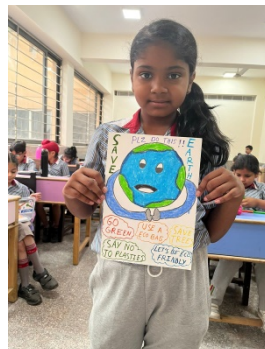


## INTERNATIONAL EARTH DAY

## **CLASS ASSEMBLY: V-E**

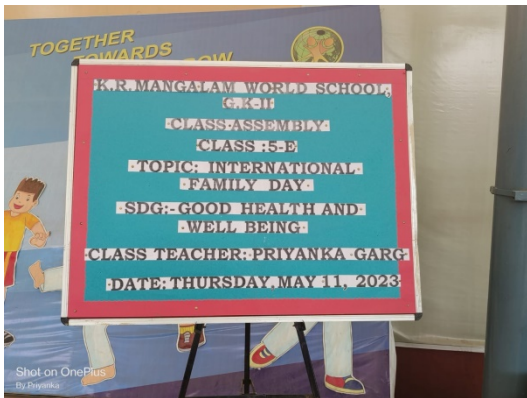
TOPIC – International Family Day

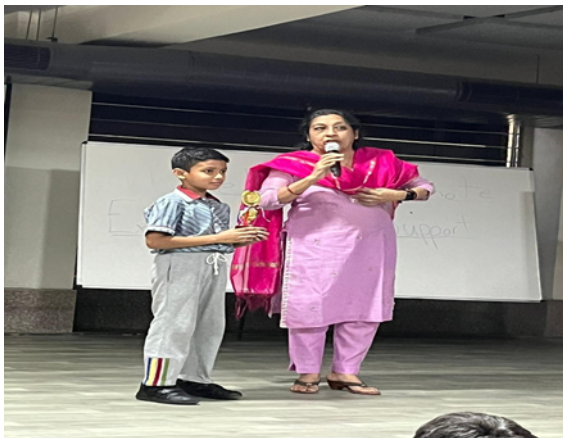
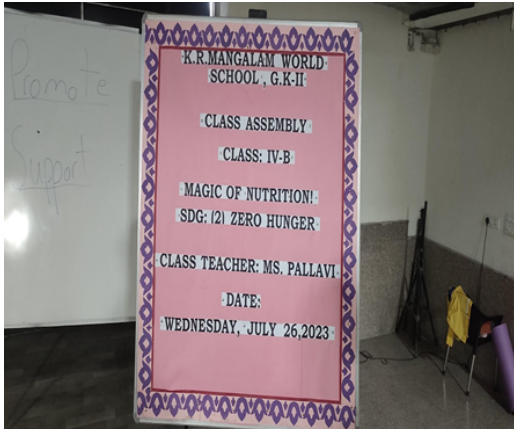




### **CLASS ASSEMBLY: IV-B**

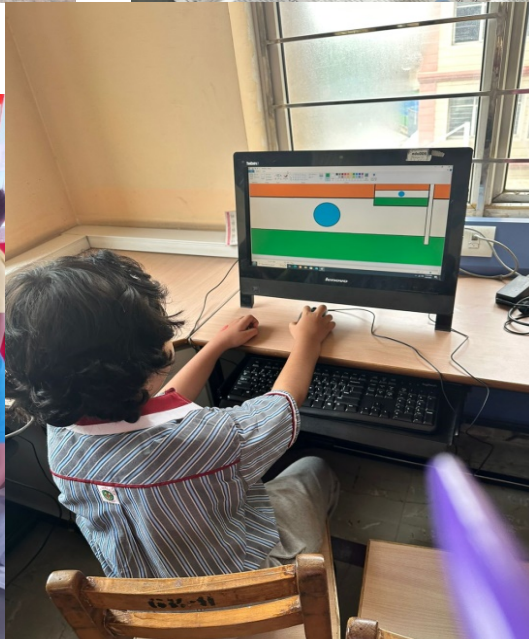

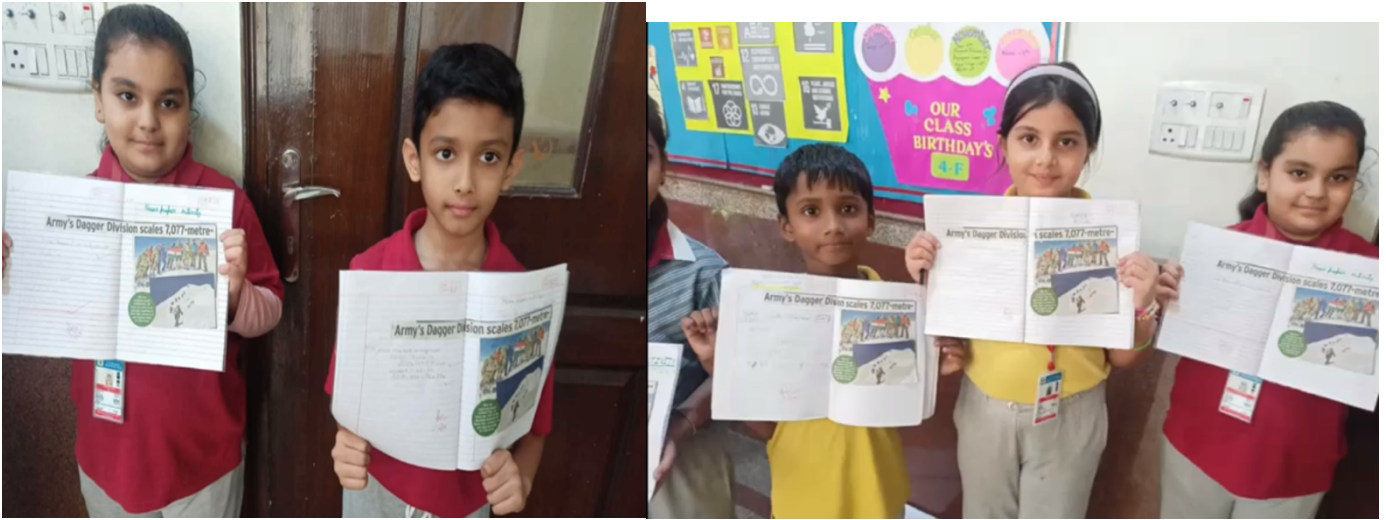

### **KHADI SKILLWORKSHOP - CLASS – VI, VII & VIII (27<sup>th</sup> JULY 2023)**

They were taught about the parts of the charkha and how each component contributes to the spinning process.

They gained hands-on-experience in spinning the charkha, mastering the art of creating yarn from raw materials. 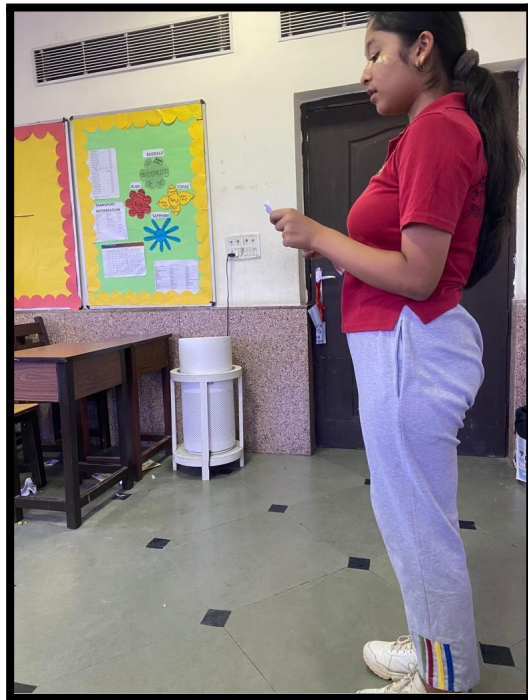

### **Position Paper Writing:**

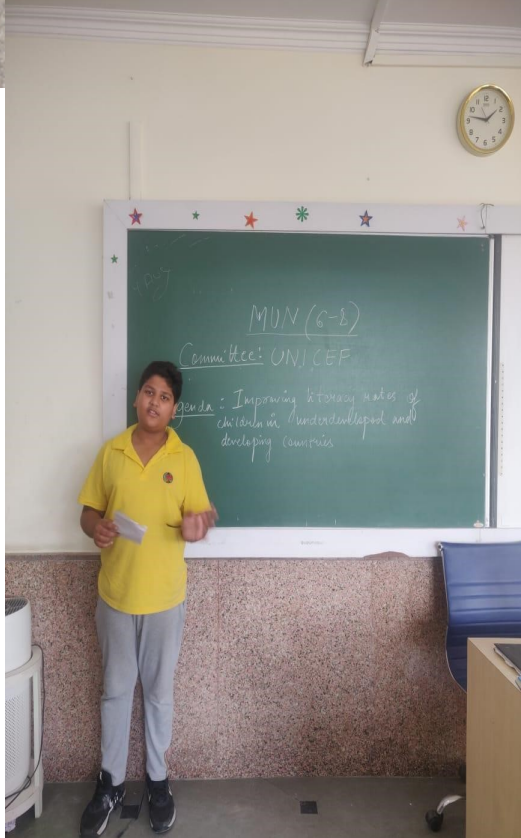

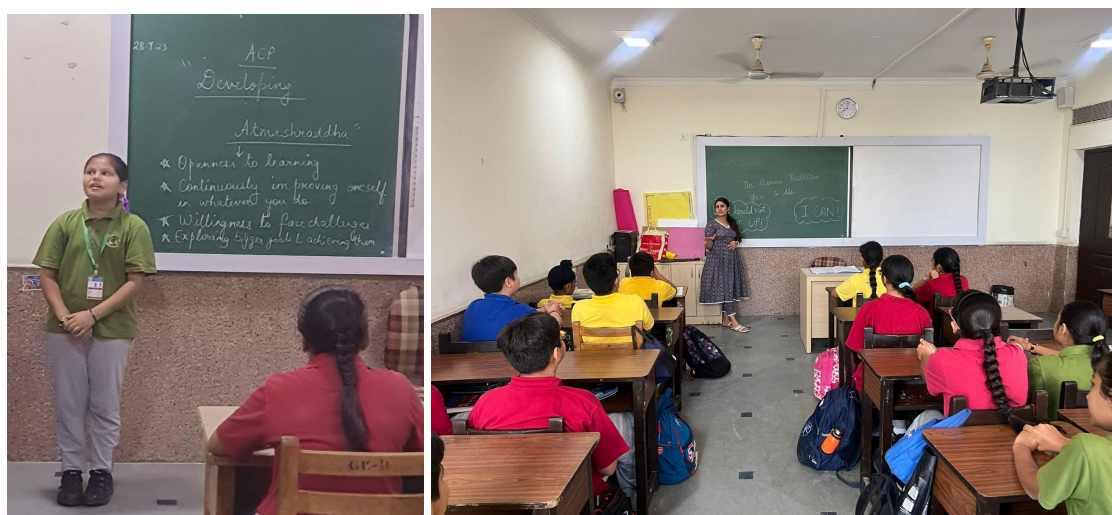
## **THE AWAKEN CITIZEN PROGRAM**

### **CLUBS ON A MISSION:**

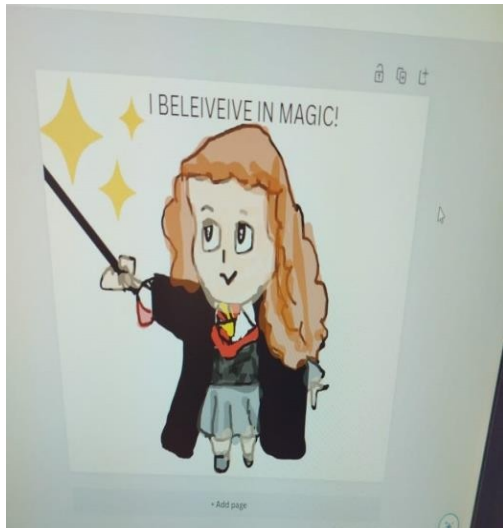

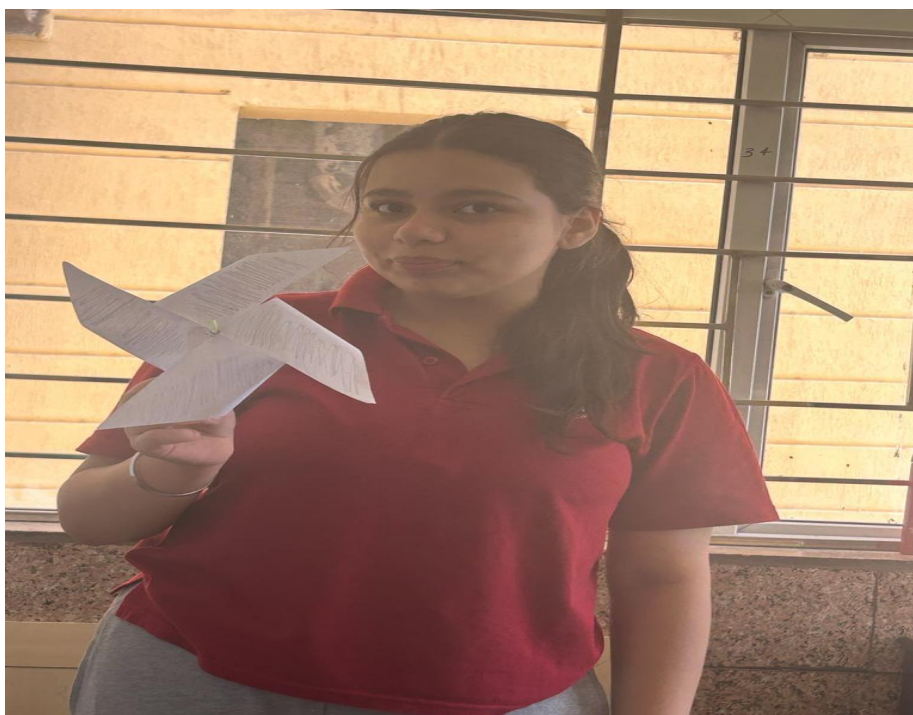
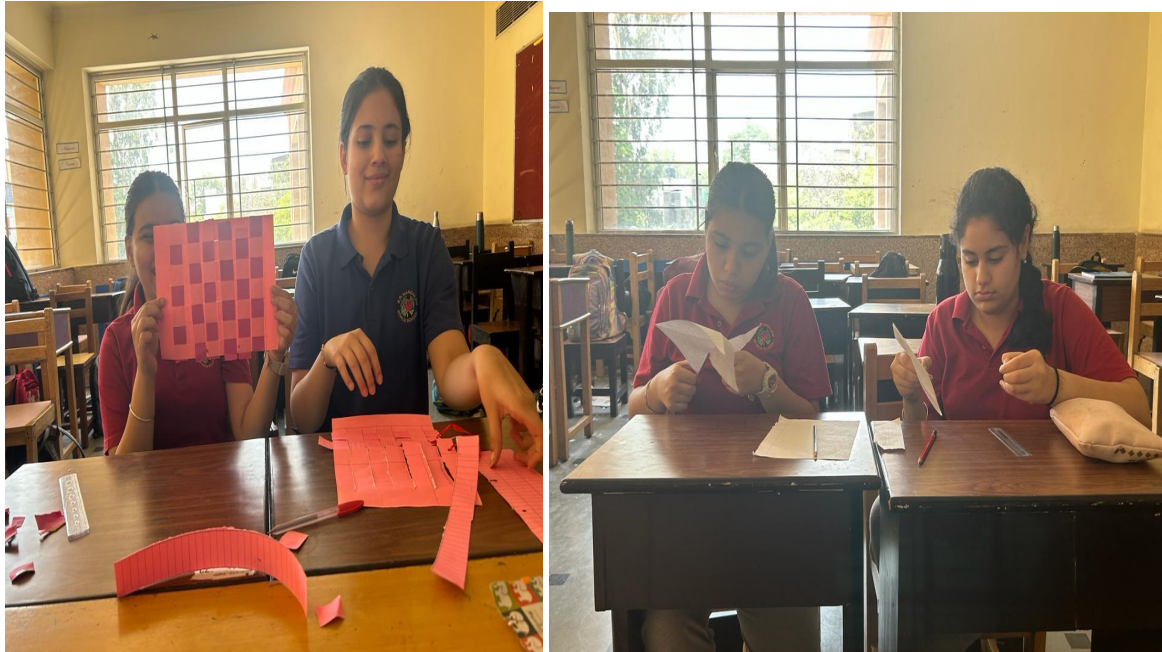

Students always participate with full enthusiasm under teacher's guidance. Through these activities students get platform to learn beyond academics and conserve their environment and become an active citizen in the society.

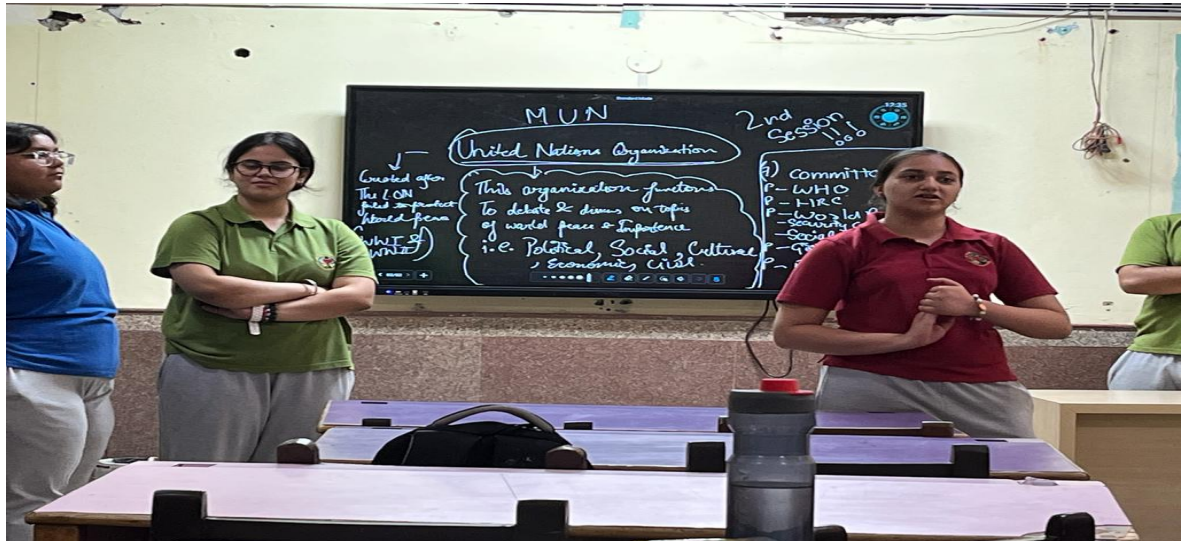


## MUN

Model United Nations (MUN) is conducted every Friday for classes 9-12 in 6th and 7th period.

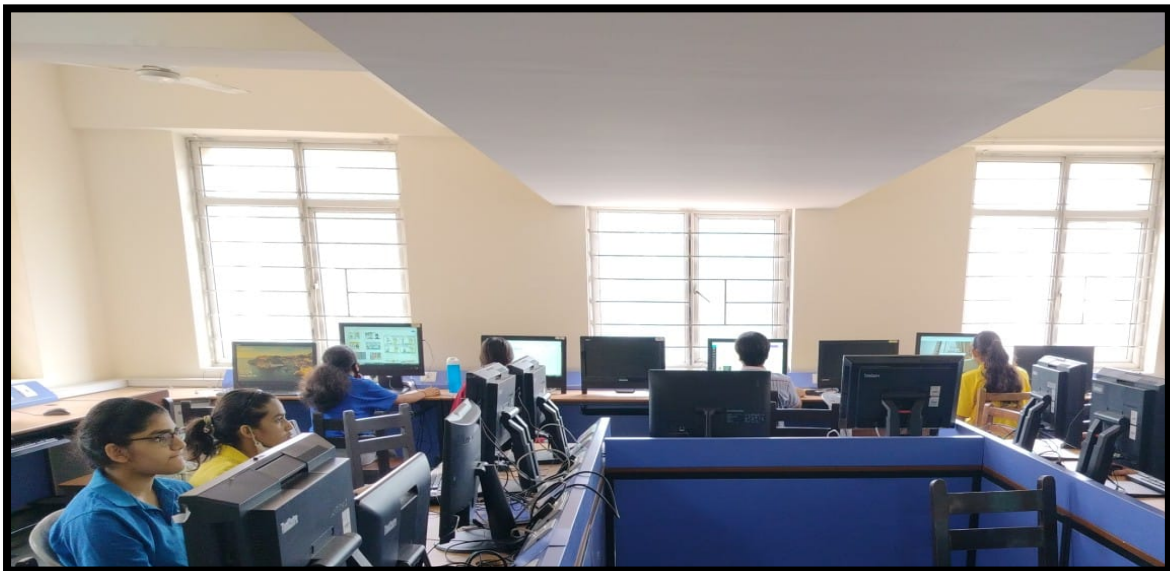
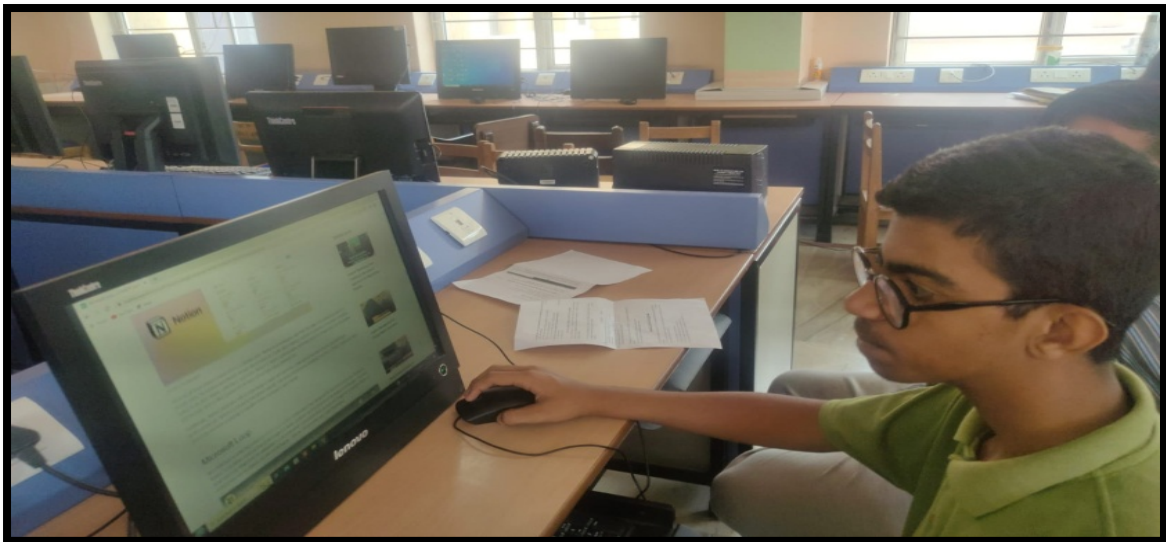
There are about 45 students in the club. There are discussions about current affairs, world affairs, new ideologies. There are many students who have received high commendation as they had put

### Artificial Intelligence Club

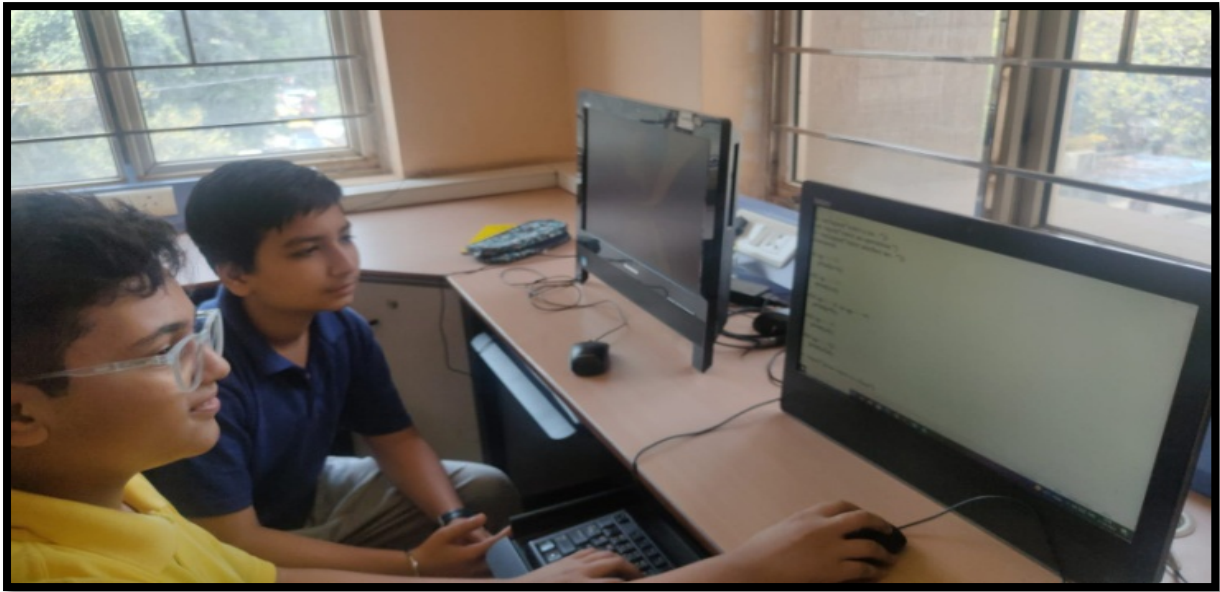

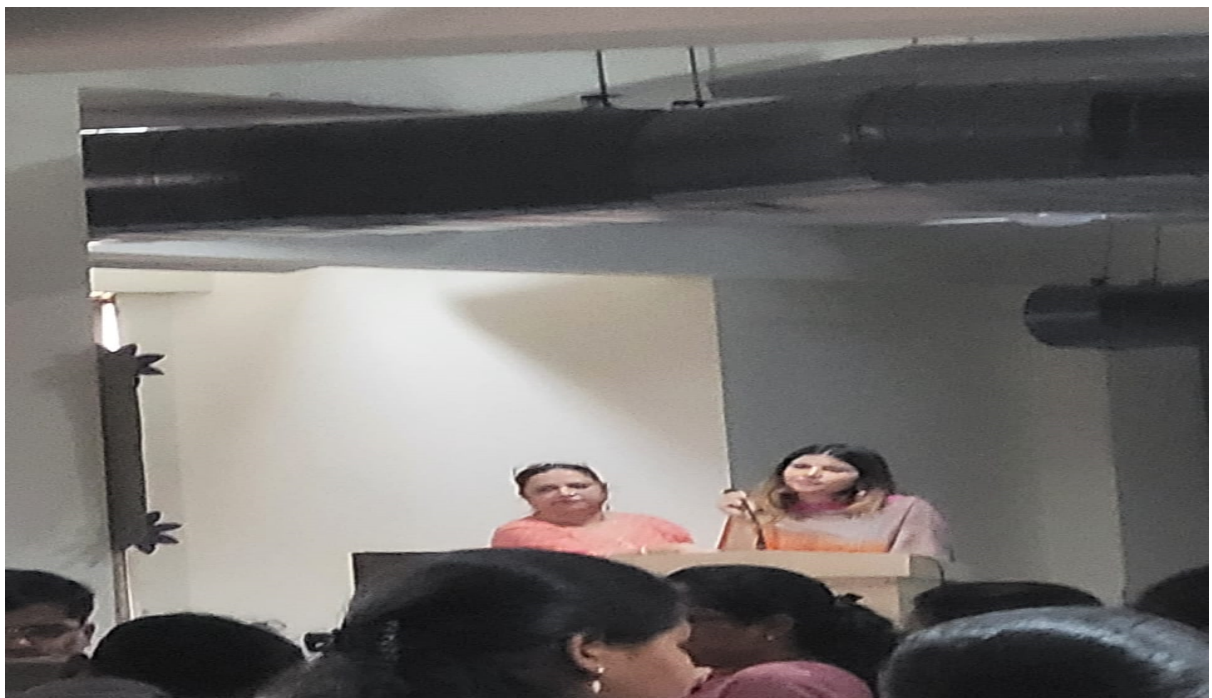

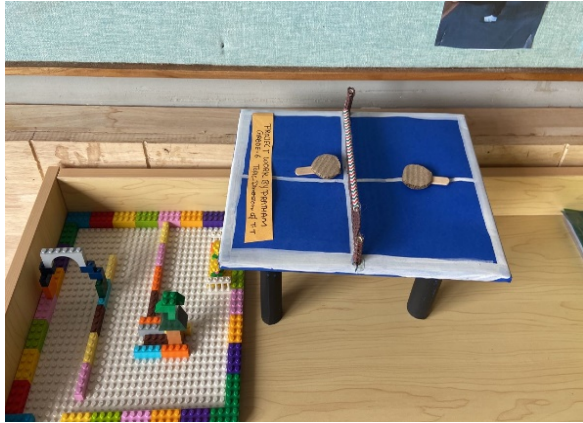
### **A New Era of Education with Cambridge Curriculum**

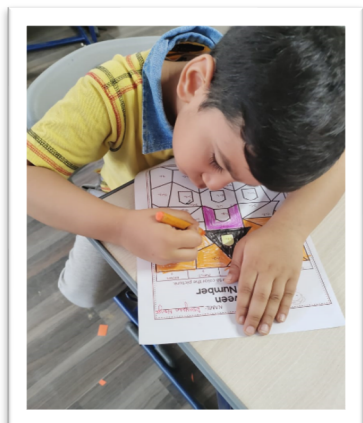

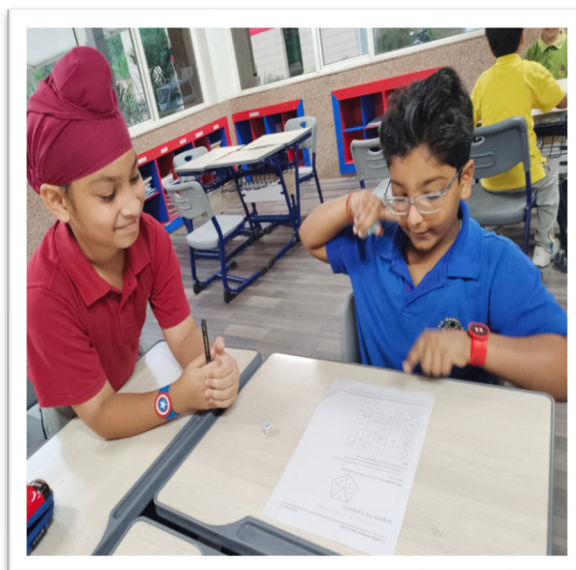

language skills. These activities create a supportive and immersive environment for students to develop their English language proficiency and foster a lifelong appreciation for the language.

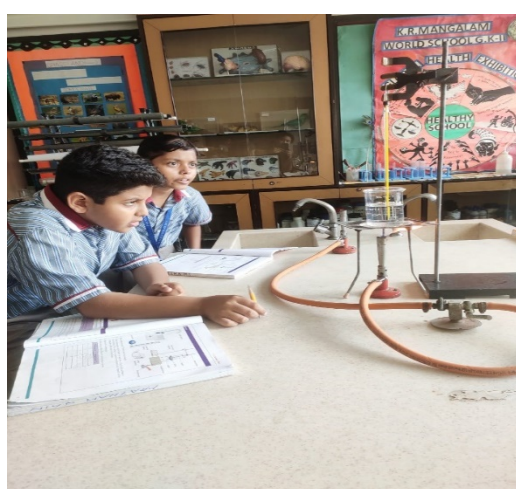
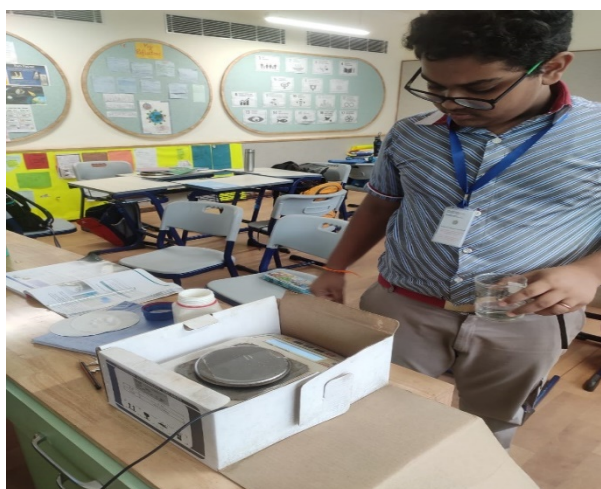


## **SCIENCE**

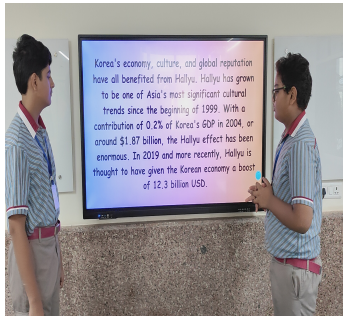


Learners of Grade 7 had a hands-on-learning with the experiment on 'Soluble with different Solutes'.

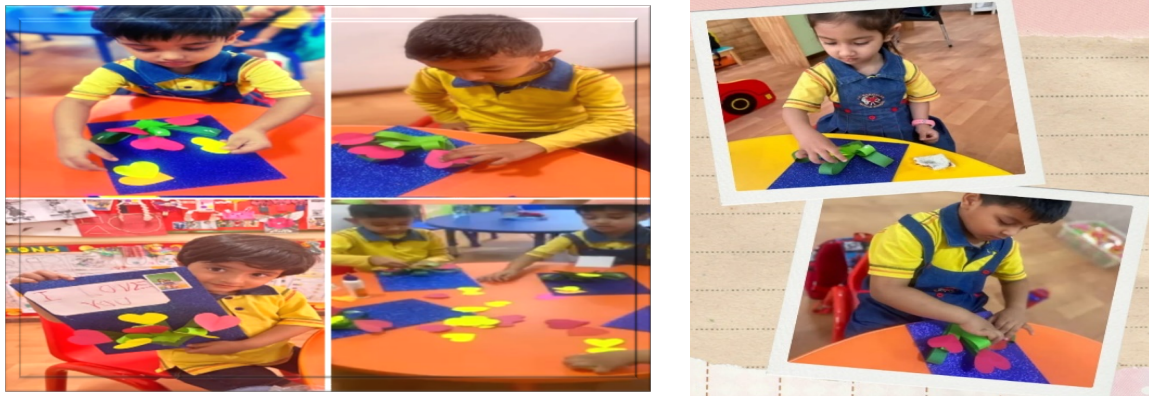




## Special days
